

## Pupil Premium Report 2014-15

The Government believes that Pupil Premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and those that are not.

### Pupils qualifying for Pupil premium are defined as:

- Those registered for free school meals (or have been at any time in the last 6 years)
- Those who are classes as Looked After Children
- Those who are from Service Families

Schools are accountable for how they have used the additional funding and must publish information relating to Pupil Premium on-line to ensure that stakeholders are fully aware of the impact of the premium. Government performance tables also capture the achievement of those covered by the Pupil Premium.

Expenditure	Cost	Purpose
Additional part time teacher	£14,958	Provide 1:1 or small group teacher to increase the % of children achieving age related expectations and making good progress.
Provision of part time learning support assistant	£9,567	To close the attainment gap for targeted pupils through small group and 1:1 support.
Staff Training	£1000	To provide staff with training to support identified learning needs.
Clubs, Educational visits, music lessons, school uniform and resources.	£3000	To involve pupils in extended learning activities, to ensure pupils are able to participate and give pupils opportunity to experience new and challenging activities.

<b>Impact</b>	EYFS – all pupil premium children made good progress from their starting points in all areas with 100% of pupils achieving a good level of development against the early learning goals.
	Year 1 – 100% of pupils are at or exceed age related expectations and have meet the level required to pass the statutory year 1 phonics test.
	Key Stage 1 Outcomes – 100% of pupils achieving at least level 2 in all areas of the curriculum with 100% achieving Level 2b+ in reading and maths & 50% achieving level 3 in reading. Progress in all areas is at least expected with good and outstanding progress achieved by the majority of pupils.
	Key Stage 2 – 100% of pupil premium children achieved Level 4b+ in all areas and are therefore secondary school ready. 60% achieving level 5 in reading. 100% of pupils made at least expected progress across the key stage (2 levels) with 60% of pupils making outstanding progress (3 levels) in reading. Attainment is at least in line with national averages.
	FSM pupils enable to engage and enjoy learning to play a musical instrument.
	All PP children enable to access school trips and residential visits.
