Pupil Premium Grant

Back ground

Pupil Premium funding is allocated to schools in respect of children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and children from service families. This applies to both mainstream and non-mainstream settings. In 2012-13 this will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM Measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit to 'narrow the gap' between children from disadvantaged circumstances and those above the low-income threshold – it is not linked to a specific child but is to be used for overall impact. However, we are held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils.

Within St Bartholomew's CE Primary School

We continue to spend our school budget with prudence and with the best interests of the children at the forefront. All members of staff, including governors, accept responsibility for 'socially disadvantaged' pupils and are committed to meeting their pastoral, social and academic needs within the school environment.

St Bartholomew's CE Primary School is committed to 'Narrowing the Gap' for all of pupils, but specifically the vulnerable pupils. The Pupil Premium forms a part of that process.

By using the Pupil Premium funding alongside the school budget, as detailed in our Pupil Premium Report, we believe we can provide all of our children with the opportunities to fully access the curriculum and raise their academic attainment.

Reporting Pupil Premium

It is the responsibility of the governors to explain Pupil Premium expenditure; this information will be published on the school website annually. This report aims to detail information on how Pupil Premium has been used within school and will detail the attainment and progress of pupils who are covered by and the intervention that has been supported by the additional funding. It will also give information on any resources bought through the fund. Reports will also detail the progress made towards narrowing the attainment gap. Regular reports will be presented on the progress of pupils supported by Pupil Premium to the Governing Body at St Bartholomew's CE Primary School.

Reporting to Parents

Parents will be able to obtain information on Pupil Premium via the school's website. This will be updated annually.

Responsibility for reporting

The responsibility for the report will be allocated to the Head Teacher, although it is teachers who will be asked to report on the intervention in place for key pupils and the impact that intervention has had.

Pupil Premium Reporting to Parents

Principles	We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all the pupils.
	We ensure that appropriate provision is made for the pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
	In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
	We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
	Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at any one time.
Provision	All our work through the Pupil Premium is aimed at accelerating progress – moving children to at least age related expectations in English and Maths.
	Pupil Premium resources used to target able children on FSM to enable them to achieve Level 3 at the end of Key Stage 1 or Level 5 at the end of Key Stage 2.
	Providing small group work with an experienced teacher focused on overcoming gaps in learning.
	Additional teaching and learning opportunities.
	Literacy focused staff training to improve to support the delivery of high quality teaching opportunities (whole class and small group provision)
	Yearly subscription Espresso education – ICT based learning package.
	Additional staffing hours for learning support - one to one and small group provision.
	Additional staffing and resources to support children's social interactions during lunchtimes.
Subsidised day visits/residential visits.	
Impact	EYFS- All FSM children made a good progress from their starting points, in all areas of the Foundation Stage Profile. With 50% of pupils exceeding the Early Learning Goals.
	Year 1 – 3 out of 4 FSM children achieved the Year 1 phonics test standard
	Key Stage 1 pupil outcomes – only one pupil entitled
	Key Stage 2 pupil outcomes – 100% of FSM pupils achieved at least level 4 in reading, writing and maths, 50% achieving Level 5 in reading and maths and 50% achieving Level 6 in maths. Attainment and achievement exceeding local and national averages.
	The majority of FSM children within the school have made good or expected progress during the academic year.
